

While this might be overkill, I know some of you care about having things centered and even! (You know who you are...you're the ones straightening picture frames – on other peoples' walls...)

Once you've printed out the flashcard PDF's double sided on regular 20lb paper (or 28lb for absolutely no "ghost" image showing through), you're ready to cut them up!

The trick is to FIRST make 4 cuts along the margins. The margin line for each side is where the dotted line ends – this will vary according to your printer, but that doesn't matter – just trim all four sides first before cutting the inside lines and your cards will all be the same size and centered 😊

The best way to cut your flashcards is to get a copy shop to cut a whole stack of them. (Copy shops generally charge \$1 a cut, so you might figure it'd be worth your while to print out 10 chapters' worth of cards and then pay \$10 to have them cut).

If you'd rather cut them by hand, use a metal knife, a SHARP Exact-o knife, and only cut through 3 sheets at a time. Make multiple light cuts rather than one heavy cut, which increases the likelihood of sheets tearing (bad) or knife skipping (very bad).
